Taft Lauds Golf; Speaks of Benefits

NEW HAVEN, Nov. 19.—Prof. William Howard Taft of Yale in discussing the benefits of golf said that golf was one of the greatest movements that have come to man. He added: "I hope to see the time not far distant when public golf courses will be offered to the public as in Scotland for those who cannot pay for costly club privileges. I would have the funds raised by taxation. Golf is preeminently a game for the people and they should be allowed to play it. Properly played it brings a self-restraint that not even the churches can exert. The presence of a golf club in a community is not like the saloon, nor like a lunatic asylum, and not like some churches, in that it exerts a beneficial influence. It always helps the surroundings, increasing the valuation of property."
