In addition to winning the point trophy, Public School 62 had the honor of supplying the only runner to break a record in the track events.


Both of the shot records fell to members of P. S. 171, Manhattan. With the 12 pound shot, J. Galligan cut a distance of 27 feet 10 inches.

CINCINNATI, Dec. 20.—After a conference between C. H.
