
MAUDE ADAMS IN NEW PLAY. Appears in J. M. Barrie's "The Legend of Leonora" Out of Town.

Judge R. G. Brown 3d in Address in Oklahoma Attacks Judicial Recall.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Dec. 29.—That the recall idea is not popular in Oklahoma, with the lawyers at any rate, in spite of its adoption by this State, was evidenced by the applause given to-night to Judge R. G. Brown 3d of Minneapolis, who was selected at the last meeting of the American Bar Association to lecture against the recall.

The association had previously gone on record as favoring the entire removal of all classes of Judges from politics through a non-partisan system of nominations.
