ALASKA RAILROAD BILL AGREED UPON

Million Dollars Appropriation for Project—President Gets Liberal Powers.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—At a final meeting of the conferees on the Alaska railroad bill to-day the form of the report was agreed on and the few remaining points of difference reconciled between the Senate and House.

The bill will go to the President if he makes the total limit of the company's authorized cost \$35,000,000, and provides for the payment by an appropriation in cash instead of from proceeds of bond issues.

The Government is authorized to build and operate telephone and telegraph lines in connection with the railroads. The President is to have the broadest possible authority in the matter.

Fix \$900 as Minimum in New York City.
