The instructions for Betty's funeral came from Mrs. Duryea by cable at the end of 25 cents a word. "Give Betty the same kind of a funeral," said the message, meaning that all Duryea dogs have money spent on them when they die and that their final resting place is in Hickory Valley, Tenn.

Betty's only fault was his propensity for looking protests to passing motor car drivers. On Monday, an automobile hit Betty while he was protesting. He died the next day.
