Dividend Payments to Policyholders Will Be Made Next Year. The mutualization of the Prudential Insurance Company of America has been fully accomplished, according to a statement issued by Forrest P. Dryden, the president of the company.

The Prudential did a business of \$13,923,821 in 1914, an increase in paid for insurance of \$185,590,828. The aggregate amount of business on the company's books at the close of 1914 was \$2,592,478,248, representing 12,855,645 policies. In his statement Mr. Dryden says:

Markets Are Now Responding Closely to Developments in the War.

A PERIOD OF RESTRAINT

An abnormally close connection seems to have been established between market news and its market reflection. Very seldom are securities at least anything like as sensitive to immediate occurrences as they are today. Wall Street is accustomed to declines on good news and rallies on bad news, but tradition is now upset and the custom of the market is reversed.

Course of Security Prices.

There is testimony to this in the swing of security prices since the mid-October advance. If the market is quoted value for bonds and stocks in the last seven months is consulted it seems to give evidence that new war in Europe has been making its mark in the processes of our business and financial recovery.

Underlying Factors of Expansion.
