INSISTS WIFE IS NEGRESS

Detroit Druggist, Suing for Divorce, Gets Court Record.

Detroit, April 17.—Arthur Little, a Detroit druggist who is suing his wife for a divorce on a charge that she is a negress, has returned here from a Southern trip, saying that he obtained all the facts necessary to prove his contention.

His proof, he says, includes an affidavit made in Xenia, Ohio, by Superintendent of Schools Graham. Mr. Graham swore that Alma Wade (Mrs. Little) was entered in a negro school in September, 1888, and continued as a pupil for five months. While she was in school Louisa Wade, now Mrs. Jefferson of Cincinnati, who some months ago made an affidavit that she was Alma's mother and later repudiated it, declaring she was only a foster mother, signed all the report cards as the real mother of the girl. Mrs. Jefferson is a negress.

PREJUDICE CAUSES MISTRIAL

Forty Jurymen Are Opposed to Common Law Marriages.

Of fifty men called before Supreme Court Justice Platzek for jury duty forty of them asserted they were prejudiced against common law marriage. For this reason the entire panel was exhausted and only ten jurors had been obtained to hear a suit for \$50,000 damages begun by Alexander Teichner, a furniture salesman of 1360 Loman place, The Bronx, against Dr. Abraham J. Long, chief gynecologist of the Lehigh Hospital, for the alleged alienation of the affections of Teichner's wife, Justice Platzek called the case a mistrial and set it over until next month.

PLEAS FOR RELIEF IN STRIP BELGIANS HOLD

Mme. Depage Says Present Aid Goes to Territory Germans Hold.

Mme. Depage, wife of Dr. Antoine Depage, surgeon to the King of Belgium, who is in New York asking for beds and food supplies for use in that small strip of her stricken country that is not in control of the Germans, said yesterday: "While Belgium can never do enough to thank America for her kindness and generosity it is only fair for you to know that all of the Red Cross supplies which you are sending go only to German Belgium, while the little strip behind the Yser, which our soldiers are still fighting to hold, is completely without supplies. Soldiers are dying by the thousands from wounds which could be cured with little attention."

MRS. ROCKEFELLER'S WILL GIVES MILLION TO CHARITY

Diamond and Ruby Ring Only Bequest to Husband in Testament Which Shows New York to Be Family's Legal Residence—\$500,000 to Relatives.

The will of Mrs. Laura Spelman Rockefeller, wife of John D. Rockefeller, was filed for probate in New York county yesterday. It disposes of an estate estimated at \$1,500,000, of which the residue, approximating \$1,000,000, goes to public institutions. Her only bequest to her husband was a diamond and ruby ring.

The fact that Mrs. Rockefeller's will is to be probated in this county indicates that her husband now regards New York city as his legal residence, rather than Tarrytown, N. Y., or Cleveland, Ohio, and that in the event of the death of Mr. Rockefeller his will will be filed here also.

The residuary legatees among which the \$1,000,000 will be divided are Euclid Avenue Baptist Church, Cleveland; Baptist Home of Northern Ohio, Cleveland; Baptist Home Society, city of New York; Woman's Baptist Foreign Missionary Society, Spelman Seminary, Atlanta, Ga., and the Bureau of Social Hygiene. The bequest to the bureau is dependent upon its being incorporated at the time the will is distributed and capable of receiving the money in a legal way.

Mrs. Rockefeller put the distribution of her estate in the hands of her husband, her son, John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and her daughter, Alta, the wife of E. Parmelee Prentice. In regard to the distribution of the estate she directed that the whole or any part of the said property as in their absolute and unrestricted discretion shall seem wise.

The will leaves \$50,000 in cash to Mrs. Rockefeller's sister, Miss Lucy M. Spelman, and her friend, Miss Caroline P. Sked, is to get an annuity of \$1,000. Mrs. Rockefeller authorized her sister and her two daughters to dispose as they see fit of her clothing, books and all personal belongings other than money, securities and such jewelry as is specifically bequeathed.

My diamond and ruby ring to my husband, John D. Rockefeller. My emerald and diamond ring, also my wedding ring, to my son, John D. Rockefeller, Jr. My ring of three colored diamonds to my daughter, Alta Rockefeller Prentice.

My pair of diamond bracelets to my sister, Lucy M. Spelman. My string of pearls, also black pearl pendant, to my daughter-in-law, Abby A. Rockefeller.

My diamond and pearl earrings to my niece, Emma McCormick. My diamond watch chain and solitaire diamond earrings to my daughter, Edith Rockefeller McCormick.

My watch with cameo and gold chain to my daughter, Edith Rockefeller McCormick.

My diamond and platinum bracelet and opal heart to my granddaughter, Abby Rockefeller.

My solitaire diamond ring to my granddaughter, Margaret Strong. My black pearl and diamond brooch to my granddaughter, Muriel McCormick.

My diamond fleur-de-lis to my granddaughter, Mathilde McCormick. My diamond and opal brooch to my granddaughter, Madeline Prentice.

My topaz and pearl brooch to my niece, Anna Rockefeller Nash. My diamond heart to my niece, Helen Rockefeller Bowler. My diamond and amethyst brooch to my niece, Florence Benjamin.

RACE "WINNINGS" VANISH

Victim Seizes Man He Accuses in Broadway Saloon.

Charles Bolschen, ice dealer, of 202 West 121st street, dragged a man by the collar out of a saloon at 125th street and Broadway last night and turned him over to Policeman Duffy, accusing his prisoner of grand larceny. The prisoner, John J. Price, 38 years old, advertising agent, of 540 West 121st street, was locked up in the West 125th street station.

Bolschen said that he met Price in Havana five weeks ago and the latter suggested they visit a poolroom. A pool was organized in which Bolschen, Price and a friend of the latter were to put in \$10,000 apiece. The ice dealer gave Price his money. According to Bolschen Price told him later that the pool had won \$105,000, and showed a check for that amount.

The ice dealer said he was agreed to meet in Savannah to cash this check and that Price met him there, but they could not get the check cashed and they could not come on to New York. After a few days here, Bolschen says, he did not see Price any more until he encountered him in the saloon. Price said that he had never seen Bolschen before.

Excutors Unrestricted. Mrs. Rockefeller released the executors from any duty to sell any part of her estate and empowered them "at the risk of my estate and without liability to me or my heirs" to sell any and every other real or personal which I may own at the time of my death or principal estate for so long a period as they in their absolute and unrestricted discretion shall see fit, notwithstanding that the same may be the subject of general trusts for investment by general rules of law or by statutory provision.

The will also contains this provision: "The better to protect and conserve the values of my properties it is my desire, and I do direct and provide, that the shares of any stock and other incorporated companies... shall always be voted by them or by their proxies at all corporate meetings as a unit."

BEQUEST TO MRS. LONGWORTH. Col. Roosevelt's Daughter Shares in Grandmother's Estate. The transfer tax appraisal of the estate of George C. Lee, who died in Newton, Mass., on March 21, 1910, shows that his granddaughter, Mrs. Alice Roosevelt Longworth, is entitled to one-sixth of a trust fund of \$79,238. Mr. Lee created the fund in 1893 for the benefit of his wife, who died recently. Besides Mrs. Longworth's share, equal amounts go to the children of the decedent, Rose Lee Grace, Harrison Lee Hammond, Caroline Lee Feasenden, Isabella Lee Mumford and George C. Lee. Mr. Lee had property in New York State worth \$14,156.

\$9,000,000 FOR HUBER HEIRS. Appellate Court Sustains Validity of Will of Brewer's Widow. The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court in Brooklyn has unanimously sustained the decree of Surrogate Ketchum appointing to probate the will of Mrs. Emilie Huber, widow of Otto Huber, by which nearly \$9,000,000 are released for distribution among the heirs.

WILLS AND APPRAISALS. Miss Eleanor Agnew, who died on January 18, 1914, at 27 Madison avenue, gave her entire estate of \$40,910 to her friend, Mrs. Edith L. Chisholm. Her will was made two days before she died and one of the witnesses was Gov. Whitman. The bulk of her estate consisted of her seventh interest in a trust fund of \$14,243, set apart in 1894 for the seven children of Dr. Cornelius H. Agnew.
