

GERMANS RUSH TROOPS TO WEST FOR BIG BATTLE

Soldiers' Trains Crowd Railroads in Belgium, Stopping All Other Traffic.

BRITISH AVIATORS ATTACK AIRSHED

Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. PARIS, April 21.—The railways from Germany to Belgium are crowded with soldiers' trains. Young, vigorous and finely equipped German and Austrian troops are being poured toward the western front.

The correspondent of The Sun is unable to obtain confirmation of the story, which may be as untrue as a previous report that Thaw had been wounded.

The announcement is as follows: "The statement in a recent German official communication that we are using asphyxiating gases in the Ypres district is false. It doubtless was made to justify the use of these gases, which have been freely employed by the enemy in their attacks on hill 60. Germany signed a clause in the Hague convention eliminating the use of asphyxiating gases."

REPULSE AUSTRIANS IN WESTERN GALICIA

Russians Inflict Heavy Losses in Defending Carpathian Height, Says Petrograd.

NO ACTIVITY IN POLAND

Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. PETROGRAD, April 21.—Securely entrenched on the heights of the Carpathians the Russians are meeting the attacks of the Germans and the Austrians with success. No attempt is being made to advance. The day statement of the Russian General Staff was as follows: "In western Galicia we repulsed an Austrian attack near Gorizia, on Tuesday night. The previous day the enemy had attacked, but without success, our positions in the region of Verkhnila, Jablonka, in the Beskids; Polen and North Oroszepak. The offensive movement of the enemy against the heights of Polen, previously captured by us, was particularly fierce and his losses were very great. The first party of prisoners captured at this point, to the number of 500, has been brought in. In the situation in other sections of the front remains as a whole unchanged."

SHELL POLISH TOWN.

German Aeroplane Drops 100 Bombs at Bialystok.

Petrograd, April 21.—Details of a raid by a German aeroplane on the town of Bialystok, in Russian Poland, forty-five miles southwest of Grodno, Tuesday morning are given in today's official statement of the Russian War Office, which says: "A German aeroplane squadron on Tuesday dropped in the neighborhood of 100 bombs at Bialystok, killing and wounding civilians. No material damage was done. For several days the town of Olechowo, was bombarded with bombs by a Zeppelin airship. No damage was done. Our aircraft successfully bombarded the railroad station at Siedlce, on the Polish frontier, in East Prussia."

QUEEN ELEVA IN GOOD HEALTH.

Report That Arm Was Amputated Without Foundation.

SUCCESS IN AFRICA.

Germans Captured Four British Companies, Says Berlin.

BERLIN, via London, April 21.—Official statement of the German General Staff of the defeat of British forces on January 18 and 19 in a two days battle at a point near Jassini has just reached Berlin. The British forces lost some 2,000 men and 100 machine guns, the losses amounted to about 700. These include the capture of four companies of men. Three hundred and fifty rifles, one machine gun and 50,000 rounds of ammunition were also captured. We captured more than 3,000 wounded prisoners.

\$7,500,000 WAR ORDERS BOOKED

American Woolen Co. Said to Have Delivered 50 Per Cent.

LONDON, April 21.—It is reported that the American Woolen Company in the past few weeks has booked over \$7,500,000 of business in war orders from foreign Governments. This, in addition to the orders taken last fall. Practically all the allied Governments are represented in this aggregate of sales.

KEEP COTTON FROM GERMANY.

Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. LONDON, April 21.—In the House of Commons this afternoon Sir Philip Magnus, Unionist member for London University, asked whether effective steps had been taken to prevent cotton from reaching Germany through neutral countries or otherwise.

Belgian King's Son Goes Well in Regimental Drill.

PARIS, April 21.—The eldest son of King Albert of Belgium, the Duke of Brabant, who recently enlisted as a private in the Twelfth Infantry Regiment, drilled last week for the first time with a platoon commanded by Lieutenant King. He served as a guide for two hours on the plains of the Ypres and is said to have performed his duties as well as the other soldiers.

PARIS "Temps" Derides Latest German Peace Propaganda.

Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. PARIS, April 21.—Deriding the latest propaganda statement that the German Government is occupied almost exclusively now with the question of peace, and contrasts Dr. Dernburg's declaration that Germany will be satisfied with the annexation or reconstitution of Belgium with Ambassador von Bernstorff's "ten commandments" published at the beginning of the war which would have reduced France to a position like that occupied by Portugal.

ALLIES LEARN LESSON

That the end of the European war will not bring disarmament by the Allies was made plainly apparent yesterday in statements by officials of American companies now manufacturing ammunition for England, France and Russia. The Allies, it was asserted, will continue to keep manufacturers of ammunition busy filling their arsenals for at least two years after the war. England, France and Russia were caught in this war bare of ammunition, but do not intend to be in the same position again. It is said: "Senator Nathaniel Curry, president of the Canadian Car and Foundry Company, which has the placing of an order of \$20,000,000 from the Russian Government for shrapnel and howitzer shells, said yesterday that his order will keep busy his own and other plants with which part of the order has been placed from May of this year when the first shells begin to be turned out, until the end of January, 1918."

TO SEIZE CHAMBORD CHATEAU.

France May Sequester Estate of Austrian Property.

PARIS, April 21.—The Magin understands that the Government is taking steps preliminary to placing the Chambord Chateau estate under sequestration as the property of Austrians. The measure has been delayed hitherto, as the property belongs to the Duke of Parma and his twenty-two heirs, some of whom do not belong to enemy nations.

SAYS YUAN WAS MISQUOTED.

Peking Denies He Made Statement Attributed to Him.

WASHINGTON, April 21.—On April 8 there was published in certain newspapers in this country a despatch signed by Carl von Rosenberg under date of March 2, from Peking, giving an account of an interview he had had with President Yuan Shih-kai. The despatch was freely quoted in the expression of his views on the present situation in China.
