

WASHINGTON AMAZED. Capital Not Ready to Believe Germans Attacked U. S. Ship.

WASHINGTON, May 26.—The announcement of the British Admiralty that the American steamship Nebraska was torpedoed yesterday off the Irish coast caused a stir here to-day second only to the shock felt when the news of the Lusitania sinking was received.

In view of the circumstances of the case officials find it very difficult to believe that the Nebraska was torpedoed and are anxiously awaiting the arrival of the ship in port to learn what statement her captain and officers have to make about the case.
