LOOTING IN MEXICO CITY BY ZAPATISTAS REPORTED

Carranza Agency Says Situation Is Serious, but State Department Has Had No Direct Word for Twelve Days.

WASHINGTON, June 30.—The Carranza agency made public to-night a despatch from the Carranza authorities at Vera Cruz stating that serious looting by the Zapatistas is reported in Mexico city. This despatch has not been confirmed by advices to the State Department, but all official reports in the last few days have indicated that serious disorders by the Zapatistas in the capital might be expected.
