Robert E. Hicks, Who Gave Himself Up After 13 Years, Goes to Indiana.

COUNTRY LIFE FOR BABES

Robert E. Hicks, a printer, who voluntarily confessed at a Bowery mission meeting one Sunday in June that he had been a fugitive from justice for thirteen years, and who was pardoned by President Wilson after serving at the Blackwell's Island penitentiary forty days of a long forgotten sentence of ten months, is reaping his reward for obeying the call of conscience.

He has accepted a position with an Indiana printing concern at a salary of \$5,000 a year, with an option of joining the firm, and has moved West with his wife and three babies to start life all over again along what promises to be pleasant lines.

The little printing shop at 634 Hudson street, which Mrs. Hicks ran while her husband was in jail, is now vacant—she moved the printing shop outfit with him—and Hicks' friends in mission work are delighted with the good fortune that has overtaken the family.

HELD AS A COUNTERFEITER.

John Kearns, whose woman companion took poison, arraigned. John Kearns, ticket speculator and confessed counterfeiter, was turned over to the Federal authorities by the police yesterday, after the coroner had decided that his common law wife, Freda Fagerstrom, had committed suicide.

Kearns waived examination. He said that he and Freda Fagerstrom had been making the counterfeit coins for seven months and had received an average of \$5 worth a day. On last Monday Kearns went to the detective bureau and said he had returned to his flat after a brief absence to treat his companion dead.

ENDS LIFE BEFORE A TRAIN.

Retired Insurance Agent Commits Suicide in Hillsdale, N. J.

C. L. Tallman, a retired insurance agent, who had been living in Hillsdale, Bergen county, N. J., committed suicide yesterday morning by jumping in front of an express train on the New Jersey and New York branch of the Erie Railroad.

Witnesses say that Tallman carefully timed his leap in front of the train, which was not scheduled to stop at Hillsdale. The fender of the engine threw him to the ground with such force that his skull was crushed and his left leg broken. The impact caused the body to rebound forty feet alongside the track.

GIRL THIEF MAY GO FREE.

Police Probably Will Reward Her for Telling of Tutor in Crime.

PASSAIC, N. J., Sept. 11.—As a reward for the assistance Catherine Collins, called "Miss Submarine," gave Capt. Benjamin F. Turner of the Passaic detective bureau in the capture of John Martin, ex-convict of Port Leavenworth prison and the most troublesome burglar operating in this part of New Jersey in years, she will probably be set free after the police complete their investigation into the fifty robberies committed by Martin and the girl in this city and Paterson have been cleared up.

"Miss Submarine," who committed fat and house robberies under the direction of Martin, was arrested a week ago. She aided in the capture of her tutor in crime and told the detectives all about half a hundred burglaries. She aided in the recovering of about \$2,500 worth of jewelry and other booty.

The girl said that Martin lured her from her home.

"I have learned a lesson," she said, "and my advice to all girls is to beware of well-dressed young men with money who make many promises."
