WOMEN HAGUE DELEGATES SEE PROSPECT OF PEACE

Convinced After Visits to the War Capitals That Belligerent Nations Would Accept Good Offices of Neutrals—Movement Started Abroad.

"We have been convinced that the Governments of the belligerent nations would not be hostile to the institution of such a common channel for good offices [a peace conference of neutral nations] and that the Governments of the European neutrals we visited stand ready to cooperate with others in mediation. Reviewing the situation, we believe that of the five European neutrals three are ready to join in such a conference and that two are deliberating the calling of such a conference. Of the intention of the United States we have as yet no evidence."

This is the crux of a statement made public yesterday here and in Amsterdam by the International Committee of Women for Permanent Peace, which was appointed at the International Congress of Women at the Hague in April last.

Miss Jane Addams is chairman of the committee and who signed the statement with her are Dr. Aletta Jacobs of Holland, Mrs. Chrysalis Mendenhall of Great Britain, the secretary, Mrs. Iloika Schwimmer of Austria-Hungary and Prof. Emily Greene Balch of the United States. Dr. Jacobson and Mrs. Schwimmer are vice-chairmen of the committee.

Not only was it possible for the women who came from belligerent and neutral nations alike to meet in the midst of war and carry forward an exchange of questions and answers, but that they were barred to one another, but as an unofficial delegation they had an audience with the Pope and the Cardinal Secretary of State in Rome.

There has been severe fighting along the northern front. According to the latest report received at Serbian headquarters the Austro-Hungarian troops on the Obrenovatz-Belgrade-Semendria-Gradiste front have lost 20,000 killed and 40,000 wounded.

Another wireless message in cipher, which was intercepted and decoded, and was supposed to be signed by the German Emperor or by Field Marshal von Mackensen, urged Bulgaria to begin operations against Serbia without delay.

Steps have been taken to organize the male inhabitants along the Macedonian frontier of Serbia into irregular bands. The Serbian territorial militia, which is organized in the Serbian army, with instructions to organize bands which will be equipped with Mauser rifles.

The Serbian Government, Nish despatches say, will be moved to Mitrovitza, close to the Montenegrin frontier, and connected with the Nish-Belgrade rail road by a branch line from Uzbak, if the invasion should menace Nish.
