BRUCKNER'S MUSIC BY BOSTON PLAYERS

Symphony Orchestra Gives an Hour and Three Minutes to Solemn Task.

The Boston Symphony Orchestra is in town again. The programme of the concert last night in Carnegie Hall comprised two numbers, Anton Bruckner's E major symphony, No. 7, and Beethoven's violin concerto.

Mastery of Counterpoint

There is enough thematic inspiration in the symphony to set up a series of a Stravinsky in business for life. The mastery of counterpoint shown in the first movement is inspiring. It is clearly evident that Bruckner has evolved new things out of old, and it flames with the glow of a large intellect.

Where Extreme Callousness Lies

As a matter of fact the extreme ugliness of this symphony is to be found in the scherzo, at a point where contrapuntal development is continuous by its absence. It is first in the melodic ideas themselves and next in their instrumental garb.
