MUST GIVE UP ALL ARMS.

Montenegrin Men, but Not Women, to Be Interned by Austria. Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. VIENNA, via Berlin and Amsterdam, Jan. 18.—The Neue Freie Presse states that the terms of the armistice between Hungary and Montenegro include the surrender of all arms, including the weapons which every Montenegrin carries as heirlooms. All males are to be assembled in one place, and there are to hand over their arms, whereupon they will be chosen districts.

The whole country is to be searched throughout to insure the complete surrender of arms and prevent the formation of guerrilla bands. All towns and villages, railroads and other means of communication are to be surrendered.

FOWNES GLOVE FIRM ACCUSED IN LONDON

RUSSIANS LOST 75,000 IN A 24 DAY FIGHT

Vienna Says "New Year's Battle" in Galicia Was Disastrous to Enemy. Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. VIENNA, via London, Jan. 18.—The "New Year's Battle" in eastern Galicia and on the Bessarabian front cost the Russians more than 75,000 men, according to an official Austrian statement received here today. On the whole 130 kilometers front (about eighty miles) the Austrians scored a complete victory. The Vienna statement says: "Our infantry supported by artillery, was the decisive factor in the fighting. We held all our positions firmly against the enemy's attacks, which at several points were in great numerical superiority."

NEW YORK GIRL DROWNED WHEN MINE SANK BRINDISI

Miss Hampl, Red Cross Nurse, Perished While on Her Way to Serbia. Special Cable Dispatch to The Sun. ROME, Jan. 18.—News of the death of Miss Stephanie Hampl, a new York nurse, when the Italian steamer Brindisi struck a mine in the Adriatic recently and was sunk was brought to Rome today by Dr. Edward W. Ryan of Scranton, Pa., of the American Red Cross, who has been making a trip through Albania and Montenegro.

Miss Hampl's body was buried at San Giovanni di Medua, Albania. Mariano Lamo, another American nurse, reached Scutari in safety. Dr. Dura Guacha was also left at Scutari. Dr. Curot reached Brindisi today and will sail for New York on the steamer Patria from Naples. There were 427 Montenegrin soldiers from the United States on the Brindisi. Dr. Ryan said.

Dr. Ryan's trip was made for the American Relief Clearing House of Paris for the purpose of investigating conditions in Montenegro and Albanian towns.

Dr. Ryan said that there were 5,000 Serbian refugees, women and children and old men, in Montenegro.

"These are sufficiently provided with food for a week," he said, "but they have no shelter, they lack warm clothing and are utterly destitute. Unless they are got out of Montenegro they will die of starvation."

The Serbian Relief Commission is now striving to solve the problem of the transportation of these refugees to Italy, whence they will be forwarded to Corsica. Dr. Ryan, in furtherance of this plan, is chartering ships and hopes to succeed in transporting the refugees across the Adriatic in spite of the mines and submarines.

The conditions in Montenegro, Dr. Ryan said, are desperate. He refused to discuss the political and military situation.

The Italian Government has given permission for the chartering by the commission of an Italian ship for the refugees and the British Red Cross also will send a ship. Thomas Nelson Page, the American Ambassador, is assisting Dr. Ryan in his relief work.
