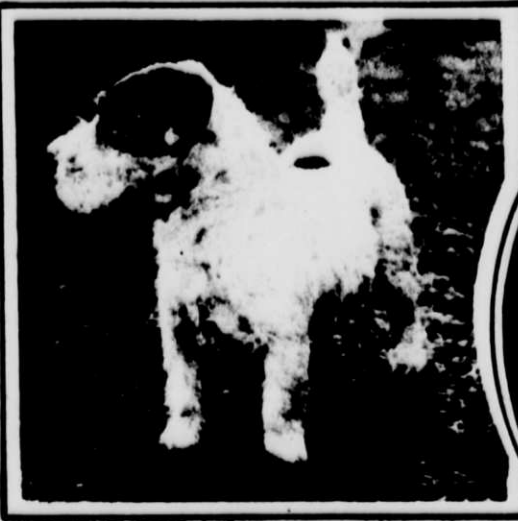


ARISTOCRATS OF THE DOG WORLD
