A campaign of publicity intended to bring home to the largest number of citizens possible the nature and extent of the national defence is the first step to be taken as a result of the convention of Mayors in St. Louis last week...

Mayor Mitchell, returning yesterday, said the meeting had been most successful, and he was optimistic over the prospect of impressing upon Congress the depth and extent of the conviction that extraordinary measures must be taken to provide a larger navy, more complete coast defence, and a better military organization.

"Any idea that we may have here," said Mayor Mitchell, "that the people of the middle West are not awake is wrong. The people there are thinking on the question of national defence. It was a revelation to people who came from all parts of the country still uninformed of the real attitude of the people furthest from the seaboard. There was no question of sentiment on the question of sea power or universal training. The people are with the President."

The resolutions adopted, which will be sent to every Senator and Representative in Congress, are in part as follows: Resolved, That we, the Mayors and members of Mayors' committees upon national defence, in convention assembled, do hereby demand the immediate authorization by Congress of the building programme of the General Board of the navy of July 29, 1915, together with such additions and modifications as their expert knowledge and experience may indicate to be necessary at this time.

Resolved, That we, the Mayors and members of Mayors' committees upon national defence, in convention assembled, do hereby demand the adoption of universal military training under Federal control throughout the United States.

Resolved, That we, the Mayors and members of Mayors' committees upon national defence, in convention assembled, do hereby demand the immediate increase, organization and disposition of the regular army as recommended by the General Staff.

Resolved, That we, the Mayors and members of Mayors' committees upon national defence, in convention assembled, do hereby demand the recognition of the military obligation equally with the civic obligation as a fundamental duty of democratic citizenship in a Republic, and to establish a system of military training alike every man in the Republic, we approve and recommend the adoption of universal military training under Federal control throughout the United States.
