

QUARANTINE DUTIES PROPOSED FOR U. S.

Whitman Would Give Station to Federal Government and Save State Money.

BRONX DINERS HEAR PLAN

Gov. Whitman attended the annual dinner of the Bronx Board of Trade last evening at the McKinley Square Casino, 169th street and Boston road. Before 500 diners, including the most prominent business and professional men of the Bronx, the Governor spoke forcibly in favor of turning the Quarantine station over to the Federal Government and of abolishing the New York State Naval School. The Governor's argument was that these institutions cost the State \$200,000 a year and that the work could be done more effectively by the Federal Government.

"The Federal Government," said Mr. Whitman, "through treaties with foreign countries may examine the physical condition of those embarking in ships for these shores prior to their embarkation. It is conceded that the United States Public Health Service, directed by men like Col. Gorgas and Surgeon-General Blue, with a force of men trained especially in the treatment of the deadly diseases which thrive in foreign lands, is better fitted to cope with them than physicians who have had no experience in such cases.

Unequal Division of Work.
"Yet when those afflicted with yellow fever, cholera and typhus are discovered on board ships they are turned over to the State of New York, while those having measles and like ills are transferred to the care of the Federal Government. The Federal Government passes upon the mental state of the immigrant, upon his criminal record, if any, upon his ability to support himself in this country, and, I may add, as to whether he has measles or chicken pox. It seems absurd therefore that the State should take upon itself the inspection to determine whether he suffers from serious contagious diseases and to treat him for this at State expense.

"It seems to me that if a division of jurisdiction is necessary this order should be reversed. But if the Federal Government is equipped to perform all these functions, and I am convinced that it is, it is not equitable nor right that the expenditures necessary to maintain such quarantine station designed for the protection of the whole country should be defrayed by this State.

"The uniformity in the administration of quarantines throughout the whole United States will be made practically complete by the transfer of the station of the Port of New York, as quarantine functions at all the ports of the United States, its possessions and dependencies are under the control of the Federal Government with the exception of the ports of New York and Baltimore. This will be to the advantage of the industries of the country as well as to the maritime interests. New York is the last to recognize this fact."

For Nautical Training Schools.
Concerning the abolishment of the nautical training school Mr. Whitman said:

"I realize clearly the necessity of having nautical training schools. I wish there were more and the State should not abandon one of them unless the Federal Government is willing to carry it on. We must insist, however, that the great State of New York is not forced by reason of the indifference of the Federal authorities to bear more than its proportionate share of the cost of government. It must be clearly understood that in the near future it will take over the school and if necessary establish new ones."

President Eugene H. Rosenquest of the organization presided. He spoke of the work accomplished by the Board of Trade and of the possibility of development in The Bronx. Surgeon Atterbury gave a brief and interesting history of The Bronx.

ART CRITIC GETS APOLOGY.

Charles H. Caffin Accepts Explanation of Architectural League.
Charles H. Caffin, art critic of the New York American, who was recently barred from the press view of the Architectural League exhibition, has received the apologies of Grosvenor Atterbury, president of the league, personally and on behalf of the league.
Mr. Atterbury explained to Mr. Caffin that the chairman of the league's press committee had been informed that Mr. Caffin no longer represented the American. He says it is not the league's policy to shut off full and frank discussion of its exhibits.
Mr. Caffin has accepted the apology, but has protested to Mr. Atterbury that the league member who barred him put a personal affront upon him. He says that as this attitude is not the attitude of the league he will give it no further consideration.

GREENHUT INJUNCTION DENIED.

Company Can't Stop the "Tribune" from Publishing an Article.
Supreme Court Justice Cobalan denied yesterday the application of the Greenhut company for an injunction against the New York Tribune restraining the newspaper from publishing an article by Samuel Hopkins Adams concerning an alleged sale by the plaintiff of the stock purchased from the defunct A. D. Matthews concern in Brooklyn.

In deciding that no temporary injunction will be issued pending the trial Justice Cobalan said:
"It seems to be the rule that an injunction will not issue to restrain an individual or a newspaper from publishing a libel where no conspiracy, no intimidation and no acts of coercion have been shown. In any event, the question raised herein should be decided upon the trial of the action."

FINED FOR FACTORY FIRE.

Owner Escapes Prison Sentence Only Because of His Loss.
A warning was given to factory owners yesterday afternoon when Louis Worth, owner of a paper cutting establishment at 41 Warren street, was fined \$150 by Judges Frosch, O'Keefe and Russell in the Court of Special Sessions. His street followed a fire on Sunday, January 9, when waste paper caused a fire which did considerable damage.
"The city of New York spends thousands of dollars annually to prevent fires," said Judge Frosch, "and all that money is wasted and lives are imperiled by such acts as yours. Had it not been that you suffered a financial loss by the fire in having to pay for the stock destroyed a prison sentence would have been imposed."
