EDUCATIONAL AID VITAL TO FILIPINOS. Broad Diffusion of Learning Best Preparation for Independence.

U. S. METHODS OF HELI. BY OSCAR KING DAVIS.

There was a vast problem in organization. Under such circumstances the American attention was attracted at once by many matters in which it seemed that the Philippines held most of the possibilities.

Early Plans of Assistance. Plans were under consideration and discussion in the days of the insurrection, and while we were fighting the Philippines we were scheming how we could arrange matters so as to enable them to obtain homes on the island and secure their property.

These three lines of activity—education, education and prompt handling of the land question, naturally constituted the first essential in the American program. The land was to be made for self-government while the people were being educated and trained to practice it.

Stand Taken by Taft. American industrial and commercial interests were clearly embarrassed. It was made plain by the blunt words of Mr. Taft at Iloilo, when he had just commercial men were not needed in the American scheme of aid to the Philippines and were at liberty to leave the islands and not to stay.

It was in this part of the program that some of the greatest evils in the first two years of the American occupation were committed. Here came in the development of transportation and communication, the sub-division of the islands, the construction of roads, the building of highways, the erection of telegraph and telephone lines, and the establishment of cable communication between the islands.

The Governor of the Moro Province was most seriously and directly concerned with the accusations against the Moro government. He had made an exceptional record and was recommended for the highest office in the Philippines.

Will Celebrate Distribution of 115,000,000 Bibles. The official central office of the American Bible Society was in New York on May 7 in the room of the Estimote.

The Bible Society is 100 years old. It was founded in 1816. It has distributed 115,000,000 Bibles. Last year it distributed 1,849,911 Bibles. A gain of 100,000 Bibles in 1914, in spite of retrenchments made by the war.
