

NEW OBSTACLE PUT IN BRANDEIS'S WAY

It's Opposition to Confirmation of Rublee as Federal Trade Commissioner.

BOTH CASES ARE LINKED

WASHINGTON, May 6.—Aided by the telephone, telegraph, printing telegraph, wireless telephone and wireless telegraph, supplied by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, the United States navy mobilized the country's forces of communication at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

By means of the above methods Secretary Daniels, sitting at his desk, talked with nearly every navy yard in the country, gave formal orders by telephone to all of them, found bulletins coming in from Brooklyn and elsewhere over the writing telegraph and then by means of the wireless got into communication with the United States ships at sea as far away as Honolulu, 4,900 miles on one side or the coast of Europe on the other.

The president nominated Mr. Rublee as a Progressive member of the Senate and he believes they have the votes to confirm him, but it is doubtful if the Senate will pass the bill.

Senator Gallinger said today regarding the action of the Senate committee in reporting the nomination of Mr. Rublee that the action was taken doubtless as the result of his statement made in the executive session yesterday that if the committee had reported the nomination he would be discharged from further consideration of it.

NAVY MOBILIZES THE WIRES; A SHIP PHONED BY RADIO

Battleship New Hampshire Gets Orders by Secret Process That No Other Navy Has—Daniels in Touch With Entire Country.

A Unique Possession.

Carthy, chief engineer of the company, declared that the United States navy was the only one in the world that possesses the secret of wireless telegraph communication with ships at sea.
