





## NEW YORK GUARDSMEN IN THE "SILENT BATTLE OF SHEEPSHEAD BAY."

Gen. O'Ryan's plan to mobilize 10,000 of the New York National Guard at Sheepshead Bay last Sunday for the Military and Naval Tournament was successfully carried out in record time. The invocation of old State blue laws prevented the use of blank ammunition and therefore the battle exercise, in which three regiments defended New York against an invader, was a noiseless, smokeless engagement. The bursting of the wooden anti-aircraft gun, a remarkable photograph of which is shown, occurred on Saturday.
