


SCENES IN PURGATORY AS PICTURED IN NEW FILM SPECTACLE

BEAUTY POSES FOR BLIND SOLDIERS




As an afternoon gown and hat. Mlle. Exiane, a Parisian actress, has devised this convertible costume as a war time economy.
