

## THE SIXTEENTH REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION



The Republican National Convention which has been making history in the Coliseum at Chicago is the sixteenth since the founders of the party, at Philadelphia, nominated Gen. John C. Fremont and William L. Dayton in 1856, and the ninth to meet at Chicago. The convention cities and the candidates between that and the present have been as follows: 1860, Chicago, Lincoln and Hamlin (elected); 1864, Baltimore, Lincoln and Johnson (elected); 1868, Chicago, Grant and Colfax (elected); 1872, Philadelphia, Grant and Wilson (elected); 1876, Cincinnati, Hayes and Wheeler (elected); 1880, Chicago, Garfield and Arthur (elected); 1884, Chicago, Blaine and Logan (defeated by Cleveland and Hendricks); 1888, Chicago, Harrison and Morton (elected); 1892, Minneapolis, Harrison and Reid (defeated by Cleveland and Stevenson); 1896, St. Louis, McKinley and Hobart (elected); 1900, Philadelphia, McKinley and Roosevelt (elected); 1904, Chicago, Roosevelt and Fairbanks (elected); 1908, Chicago, Taft and Sherman (elected); 1912, Chicago, Taft and Sherman (Sherman died before election, Nicholas M. Butler substituted; defeated by Wilson and Marshall).
