

POLES TO NEGOTIATE WITH RUSSIAN REDS

Patek Tells Diet He Counts on Allies' Support.

WARSAW, Feb. 6 (Delayed).—Peace overtures by the Soviet Government of Russia will be considered by the Polish Government, according to a despatch sent to-day to M. Tchitcherine, Bolshevik Foreign Minister, by Stanislaus Patek, Polish Minister of Foreign Affairs. M. Patek's reply follows:

"The Polish Government acknowledges the receipt of the wireless declaration of the Government of the Russian Soviet Republic dated January 29, 1920. That declaration will be considered and the answer will be communicated to the Russian Soviet Government."

Before sending the message M. Patek informed the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Diet that he would send wireless message to Moscow acknowledging receipt of the latest Bolshevik offer to negotiate and telling the Soviet Government that the offer would be answered after it had been considered by the Diet.

M. Patek assured the committee that France and England were ready to help Poland if the Soviet administration of Russia would not agree to just terms of peace.

BROWN TIN BOX HELD NEWBERRY'S MONEY

Campaign Manager and His Chief in Close Accord.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Feb. 7.—Truman H. Newberry received letters concerning the 1918 Senatorial campaign from the Detroit headquarters and the manager of the campaign used Newberry's letter box when in New York, according to testimony at the election conspiracy trial here to-day. The testimony was given by Mrs. Annabelle Hamilton of the stenographic force of the campaign committee.

Mrs. Hamilton gave the jury an inside glimpse into the Detroit headquarters, touched on its finances and told of a "brown tin box" in the vault in which she saw "bunches of wrapped up bills."

School Books Arouse Suspicion. A Richard Miller, 24, said to have been arrested on narcotic and burglary charges under other names, and to have escaped twice from Harlem Court while awaiting trial, was arrested yesterday at Broadway and Bleeker street. He was carrying some new school books under his arm. Miller was held in \$5,000 bail for examination. He said he was living in a Bowery hotel.

NEW YORK LEADS WAR CASUALTIES

Lost More Soldiers in Fighting Than Any Other State.

SPECIAL DESPATCH TO THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD. WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—In the number of casualties suffered by members of the American Expeditionary Forces New York stands at the head of the list of States in the complete statistical summary made public to-day by the War Department.

The total number of casualties suffered by New York officers and men was 46,222. Of this number 254 officers and 4,528 enlisted men were killed in action; 84 officers and 1,735 enlisted men died of wounds and 70 officers and 1,252 men died of disease. The wounded numbered 1,593 officers and 28,946 men.

VALUABLE FILMS BURN

Loss in Oliver Company's Quarters Put at \$200,000.

Losses estimated at \$200,000 were caused late last night when a fire, starting in the cellar of the building occupied by the Oliver Film Company at 308 East Forty-eighth street, burned through to the upper floors and destroyed valuable rolls of film.

A fireman, James McMahon, of Hook and Ladder Company No. 7, was carried from the second floor unconscious, having been overcome by smoke.

WILLIAM D. VAN VLECK LEFT \$5,000,000

Invested \$200,000 of his \$5,000,000 Fortune in Liberty Bonds during the War.

William D. Van Vleck, who died December 1 at his home in Montclair, N. J., invested \$200,000 of his \$5,000,000 fortune in Liberty bonds during the war. This fact was shown yesterday when a petition was filed with the Surrogate of Essex County for deposit of securities.

The list of securities held by Mr. Van Vleck included shares in many public utilities, among them the New York Central Railroad, the Pennsylvania Railroad, the American Telegraph and Telephone Company and the El Paso and Southwestern. He also owned many county and city bonds.
