

JUGO-SLAVS STAND FOR WILSON LINE Unlikely to Accept Either the Paris Compromise or the London Pact.

TO REORGANIZE CABINET Say Internationalization of Fiume Leaves Italy in Control of Gulf.

Special Cable, Copyright, 1920, by THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD. LONDON, Feb. 14.—The Jugo-Slavs will not accept either the Paris compromise or the London pact, according to advices from Belgrade. The Government is to be reorganized next week so as to form a coalition to take a definite stand for the Wilson line as the minimum Adriatic settlement, according to information obtained by THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD from the highest authorities. This means that the Adriatic problem is far from being settled, as the Council of Three seem to believe. Negotiations at present are in the hands of Mr. Trumbitch in London, but there is reason to believe that he will delay a definite answer to the Council until the new Jugo-Slav Government has been established, despite the peremptory character of the note handed to him yesterday. It is learned that the Allies did not comply with the Serbian request for a copy of the Pact of London; the document supplied contained only extracts, although Mr. Trumbitch had been instructed to demand the entire text. This probably will be given as a reason for delaying the decisive reply which the Allies seek to exact. The formation of a coalition cabinet in Jugo-Slavia, it is stated to the SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD by a person who is engaged upon that task, is prompted by the belief held by all parties that the proposed Paris settlement chokes Serbia's single outlet, Fiume. While on the face of the proposal the internationalization of the city affords the Jugo-Slavs access to the sea, the details show that Italy gets complete control of the Gulf of Fiume. The new Jugo-Slav government is determined to resist this to the uttermost although it is not saying what the uttermost may be. Internally the first task will be to call a constituent assembly to determine whether or not the boundaries have been determined finally. A report that it is likely the Prince Regent will resign is denied authoritatively and it is stated that he is cooperating fully in the organization of the new cabinet. Mr. Trumbitch, who is the Serbian representative to the peace conference,

refuses to discuss the note sent by the Allies to him or his reply, which is not yet completed. The peace conference discussed the Adriatic situation again to-day but no announcement concerning any decision reached is made.


