CURB ISSUES TAKE AN UPWARD SWING

Rise Is General After Early Display of Irregularity and Trend of Easing Off.

Following early irregularity in the morning, when there was a tendency in many issues to ease off, a general upward swing occurred in prices for stocks on the curb yesterday. While considerable inside buying was reported, particularly in the oil, short covering added materially in the higher trend later in the session. Business, however, was on a comparatively small scale and, with a few exceptions, movements were not so wide as in recent seasons.

White Oil, which follows closely the movements of Simms, gained about two points, and a firm tone was displayed in International Petroleum, Carbide and Tropical Oil. Mining stocks continued active and strength in the Tonopahs was shown.
