

R. H. McCormick's Art Collection to Be Dispersed

Notable Assembly of Portraits Including Reynolds, Romneys and Raeburns.

The announcement made yesterday by the American Art Association, that the famous art collection of the late R. H. McCormick of Chicago is to be sold here in April, will cause a decided stir in art circles.

Many of the paintings are already familiar to the public, since they have figured in many great loan exhibitions, such as those in Copley Hall, Boston; the Chicago Art Institute; and the World's Columbian Exposition.

The greater portion of the works were procured during Mr. McCormick's many trips abroad, principally in England. He secured so many English portraits by the great masters that they may be said to dominate his collection, although many works by the so-called "little masters" are also represented.

Among the Turners are the "Snowden in North Wales," which was once owned by the Bishop of Tasmania, who purchased it directly from Turner himself, and the "Hath Abney," which was shown at the Royal Academy in 1798.

There also are John Hoppner's "Portrait of a Young Girl," Sir Thomas Lawrence's "Miss Barron" after Mrs. Ramsay, and Lawrence's "Marchioness of Ely," "Lady Darnley," "Mrs. Norton," "George Romney's 'Alexander Blair,' 'Lady Hamilton' and 'Lady Beauchamp,' 'Francis Cote's 'Portrait of a Young Girl,' 'John Galt's 'Portrait of a Young Man' and 'Portrait of a Woman,' 'Sir William Beechey's 'Lady Beechey' and the 'Bride of Augustus at Rimini,' and two other landscapes by Wilson.

Caruso Singing "Le Prophete" at Metropolitan

At the Metropolitan Opera House yesterday the opera presented to a large matinee audience was "Le Prophete." Mr. Caruso, happily recovered from his recent indisposition, was again the impersonator of the innkeeper who became a prophet.

No evidence of the cold remained to mar his singing, which had its usual vigor and thrilling quality of tone. Mme. Matzenauer, who on Thursday represented a character created by one of Meyerbeer's severest critics, was a pathetic and impressive figure as Fides. She sang "Ah, mon dieu" much better than she did at the previous performance of the opera.

Mme. Claudia Muzio repeated her Bertha. It is not one of her best roles, but her fine voice and her artistic methods added to the general results of the afternoon. Jose Mardones, Louis d'Angelo and Octave Dux were three very crafty Anabaptists and Leon Rother a Count Oberthal whose wickedness was wholly artistic. Arthur Bodanzky conducted.

In the evening a double bill afforded the audience opportunity to hear several singers. "Cavalleria Rusticana" was sung by Mme. Florence Easton, Miss Flora Perini, Giulio Crimi and Thomas Chalmers. It was followed by "Le Coq d'Or," in which Mmes. Barrientos and Sundelius, Messrs. Diaz and Didur were the chief singers and Miss Gail and Mr. Bolm the principal dancers.
