

SENATE READY FOR RAIL BILL TO-DAY

Speedy Passage of Measure Passed by House Saturday Expected by Leaders.

LABOR HOPES FOR VETO

Only One Roll Call Necessary—La Follette, Proposed, May Try Filibuster.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—Speedy action is expected in the Senate tomorrow on the report on the railroad bill which passed the House yesterday.

Unless Senator La Follette (Wis.) undertakes a filibuster against the report, which he is expected to do, the measure will be passed.

Meanwhile the leaders of the sixteen railroad brotherhoods will assemble in Washington to take action on the tentative agreement between the President and Director-General Hines for the creation of a tribunal to settle the existing disputes regarding wages and working conditions.

The settlement of the wage controversy under the scheme proposed is expected to take effect on the expiration of the present agreement.

Provision is made for the immediate creation of a committee of experts to correlate available data from previous hearings and for a settlement committee to be appointed by the President.

It is apparent that the labor organizations will base their hope of defeating the bill entirely on the President.
