

BURR SCENTS DANGER IN CRAIG SCHOOL BILL

Corporation Counsel Raps Comptroller.

The mind of Corporation Counsel Burr does not run along with that of Comptroller Craig, at least in the matter of the education law. Mr. Burr issued a terse criticism yesterday of Mr. Craig's bill, introduced in the Senate by Senator Burdette and creating a board of education whose three members would be appointed respectively by the Mayor, the Aldermanic President and the Comptroller.

Mr. Craig's proposal, so Mr. Burr objected, is "one solely designed to fix up the control of educational affairs in the city of New York to suit the views of the head of the Department of Finance (meaning Mr. Craig), without regard to any correction of the general situation

obtaining throughout the State. It is far more important that the Statewide evil in city school affairs should be corrected than that the temporary advantage of a particular official (meaning Mr. Craig) should be promoted in the city of New York."

Mr. Burr, conceding that school conditions "have become intolerable," added a recommendation for the bill of Senator Kaplan introduced Friday.

TAX ON MATCHES PROPOSED.

Bill Is to Raise Revenue for Soldiers' Bonus.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28.—A tax of 1 cent on every hundred matches, to be paid by the purchaser, was proposed in a bill introduced to-day by Representative Ackerman (N. J.) as a means of raising revenue for the bonus for soldiers' movement.

Discussing the measure members declared that the burden of the tax would fall upon smokers.
