

OUTLAW SOCIALIST PARTY, IS DEMAND

Majority Report Will Prescribe Laws Making This Possible.

THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD, Sunday, March 20.—The majority report is now being written in the case of the five Socialist Assemblymen who were tried for disloyalty to the State and treason. After deliberating more than a week over the evidence Louis Martin, chairman of the Judiciary Committee, is preparing the first draft of the opinion. The expectation in the capital is that the recommendation of the majority will be about as follows:

Outlaw the Socialist party by prescribing the laws which will put the party out of existence.

Secure the five Socialist Assemblymen of their loyalty to their party principles, which are held to be inimical to the State.

There will be a minority report. How many will sign it is entirely a matter of guesswork. One such report has been written and filed with the committee; it is understood Assemblyman Evans is intended to be its author. He was against removal from the start.

The minority report is believed to recommend that the five Assemblymen be expelled. It is understood that Mr. Evans will take the position that the expelled Assemblymen are guilty of the charges made against them; that the charges were proven, but that it is the business of the Legislature, to take on the case. Those who hold that position maintain that the voters knew the political beliefs of the Socialists when they were elected, and that the voters passed on the issues and the Legislature cannot be authorized to go further.

In all probability the majority report will subordinate the individuals to the party and lay great stress on the loyalty of that organization. The Legislature probably will be asked to enact laws which will put the party out of running in this State. The result of that will be a double headed bill in this Legislature. First will come the control over unseating the five Assemblymen, then over rewriting the laws dealing with Socialism.

Mr. Martin is expected to submit his draft of the majority opinion to the Judiciary Committee for discussion and revision. He will review the evidence of great length. Every member will be permitted to incorporate all his ideas in the report. That freedom will be given for the purpose of obtaining a majority. The report probably will not reach the Assembly until next week.

There is a disposition to postpone the report for a reasonable length of time, as there is long enough delay, special sessions cannot be called, and the Socialists cannot be sent back again to prison this session.


