Runs 1,500 Meters in 3:57 at the Wanamaker Institute Games.

OLYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM FIRST TO GO

Leaves Next Week for Tournament at Antwerp—Eleven Men in Squad.

To the United States hockey team will go the distinction of being the first to leave America for the Olympic games at Antwerp. Arrangements for their transportation on the Finland next Wednesday were completed yesterday by the American Olympic committee, which also discussed the matter of the team's equipment and the details of their final practice in this city next week.

The first game of the Olympic hockey championship is to be played on April 20, and the American seven therefore will have about four days for final tuning up, for they are due to reach Antwerp on April 16. Including substitutes the team will include eleven players and they will be in charge of Roy D. Schooley.
