

Metropolitan Racing Season Opens at the Jamaica Track This Afternoon With the Paumonok Handicap Feature

BOOTS AND SADDLES TO RING OUT TO-DAY

Local Racing Season Will Open With Paumonok Handicap at Jamaica.

For the first time in more than six months "boots and saddles" will ring out on a local race track this afternoon. The thoroughbred season will open here from the quantity and quality of the entries it promises to be the most successful opening in this State since the repeal of the Percy Gray law in 1908. Nearly one hundred horses have been named to compete in the six events, and among the entrants are horses which have earned nationwide fame and a fortune for their owners by their speed and stamina.

The Paumonok Handicap for three-year-olds and upward at six furlongs is the feature of the programme. It has an added value of \$5,000 and the most of this prize, a good deal of good horses are named to go to the post.

Leading the list is S. C. Hilliard's renowned colt Lucullite. He has been assigned the post of favorite because of his ability, the juvenile champion of 1918 and one of the best sprinters in the country, is second on the list with 125 pounds. Lord Brighton has been assigned 115 pounds because of his ability in 1917, 15 pounds. The others are in with lighter burdens, but Walter S. Vosburgh, the official handicapper, has done his work well, and every one of the dozen entrants has a chance to win the coveted prize.

Although Lucullite is in prime condition it is not likely he will start. The track was ankle deep in mud last night and Lucullite is not a muddler. All of his poor races last season were in heavy going, and unless the track dries out it is probable Mr. Hilliard will depend on Lord Brighton and Valve to carry his colors.

Because of Lucullite's tendency to founder on a heavy or slippery track Billy Kelly probably will be the favorite. He is one of the best mud runners in the country, and although he has been beaten several times in Maryland this spring he still has a host of admirers who proclaim him the best sprinter in America.

A. Clark's Dunboyne, which was a failure last season, has been working wonders in his recent trials, and will have many friends. He probably will go to the post one of the first three choices.

Old Rosebud, the veteran campaigner, is in with 111 pounds, and on a muddy track promises to give a good account of himself. He has been working well since his return from Maryland, and Frank Weir, his trainer, is confident he will run one of his best races if the track remains heavy.

Sea Mint, the three-year-old colt belonging to Thomas Fortune Hahn, has been running exceptionally well in his trials at Belmont Park. He will carry only 100 pounds and is likely to go to the post well supported. Arnold, who beat the champion Camille as a two-year-old, is in with 111 pounds, and the tip has gone the rounds that he has worked faster than any horse in the race. He has been campaigning all winter, and according to Larry Heller, his trainer, is better now than at any time in his racing career. He likes the mud, too, and the trainer's tip may be a good one.

Vice-Chairman Royalist, Cromwell and Lucullite will shoulder only a feather and any one of them is likely to slip through to victory if their more renowned and heavier weighted opponents make any mistakes.

SIR BARTON KING OF TURF

Vosburgh Makes Him Pound Better Than Lucullite. Sir Barton was the king of the turf as well as the champion three-year-old last season in the estimation of Walter S. Vosburgh, the official handicapper. In the weights for the Metropolitan Handicap announced yesterday Mr. Vosburgh places Commander Ross's great colt at the head of the list with 120 pounds, one pound better than S. C. Hilliard's older horse Lucullite and two pounds better than Purchase.
