DR. E. H. M. SELL DIES; WAS NOTED SURGEON Last of 7 Founders of American Academy of Medicine.

Dr. Edward Herman M. Sell, well known in medical circles throughout the world for his discoveries, died last night at his home, 137 West Ninety-fourth street, at the age of 87.

Dr. Sell, who was 87 years old, was the last of the seven founders of the American Academy of Medicine, which was established in 1876. He had received many degrees from universities both here and in Europe.

Born in Lehigh county, Pennsylvania, Dr. Sell was trained originally for the law in the country at Gettysburg, Pa. He studied medicine at Bellevue Medical College, and amplified these studies in other institutions.

Dr. Sell was abroad during the Franco-Prussian war and remained in Paris during the entire period of the siege. He was twice a delegate from this country to the International Medical Congress. He married Miss Anna J. Lloyd of Delphos, Ohio, twenty-two years ago.
