

TAMMANY DRIFTING TOWARD MARSHALL

On Wigwam Special Rolling Over Prairies Fear of Displeasing Bryan Is Manifest.

COULD POSSIBLY BE TOO WET?

100 New Yorkers Attend Early Mass and Hear Political Sermon in New Mexico.

AROUND THE TAMMANY SPECIAL, EN ROUTE TO SAN FRANCISCO, ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., June 20.—While the first few days information has reached the Tammany leaders who are on their way to the Democratic National Convention at San Francisco which indicates that President Thomas R. Marshall of Indiana is likely to be the compromise candidate of all factions of the party for the Presidential nomination.

The 100 of Tammany delegates to the convention of the Tammany delegates of the party, but they expect that William J. Bryan will oppose the nomination of Charles D. Wick of Ohio. It is too close to call at this time. Mr. Marshall is understood to be acceptable to Mr. Bryan as well as to the wet faction of the party. Mr. Marshall is very popular with the Tammany delegation. With this fact in mind, beyond a doubt he would be the Democratic next choice. It is possible also that Charles E. Murphy, Tammany leader, is favorably inclined toward Marshall and that a powerful combination in New York, Massachusetts, Illinois and Indiana is forming to support him prominently before the convention.

The Tammany men are proceeding upon the theory that William G. McAdoo is what he said last week and is definitely eliminated from the race. The fact that some of the chief McAdoo supporters are swinging into line behind Senator Carter Glass of Virginia is also of great importance. For the reason that the New York City leaders expect to follow the convention will nominate a southern man for President and there is the risk of defeat in the Northern States where the city of Southern domination of the party already has been noted.

It is expected that when the balloting begins Cox and Marshall will open a struggle, with Attorney-General Palmer and Gov. Edwards of New Jersey as secondary factors. Palmer and Edwards are expected to fall to the rear rapidly. The field will be left open for Cox and Marshall, then the final combination will be made that will determine the choice between these two; at least that is the way it looks on board the Tammany special.

Boston, June 20.—The second and major part of the Massachusetts delegates and alternates to the Democratic National Convention left here today for San Francisco. Staff Chairman Michael A. Cleary decided at the last moment not to accompany them.

WARSAW, June 18 (Delayed).—The Bolsheviki are reported to have assembled fifty divisions for the mid-summer drive against Poland, which military observers consider to be now in full swing, the Reds attacking at various points along a 1,200 kilometer front.

Kiev is again in the hands of the Bolsheviki, who are also giving renewed attention to the northern front. The so-called gateway between the Dvina and the Berezina, through which they hope to break, sweeping into Minsk and Vilna and forming connections with East Prussia.

Encouraged by the recapture of Kiev, Gen. Budenny is continuing his raids. The forces of Gen. Izyk Shkily, the Polish commandary, are making a stand west of the River Nibren, front, extending roughly southward to the Dniester.

Speculation regarding the fate of the Ukrainian Republic, reorganized by Gen. Plonski, is making. Some of the news papers opposed to Poland's Ukrainian policy are calling Petlura's Government, a government on wheels. Petlura's executive train has moved time and again since the fall of Kiev.
