

GREEKS PICK BRIDES FROM GIRLS ON SHIP

Scores of 'Maids of Athens' Arrive to Wed Swains They Never Saw.

IDENTIFYING BY PICTURE

The detention quarters at Ellis Island are so crowded that it has become necessary to hold aboard ships recently arriving a large number of immigrants.



DENIAL BY LOUIS GIMBEL

Vice-President of Firm, to Plead in U. S. Court To-day; Says Suit Is Unjustifiable.

An indictment containing 207 counts and alleging profiteering under the Lever act was returned yesterday by the Federal Grand Jury against Gimbel Brothers and Frederick Gimbel, vice-president, Joseph J. Dowdell, general merchandise manager, and Charles D. Slawter, buyer of men's clothing, who were arrested Saturday on warrants obtained by agents of the Department of Justice's "lying squad."
