FEDERAL RESERVE BANK STATEMENT Members Resume Borrowings on Large Scale.

WASHINGTON, July 3.—Resumption of member bank borrowings on a large scale and substantial increases in deposits and Federal Reserve note liabilities is indicated by the Federal Reserve Board's weekly bank statement for the week ended at the close of yesterday's business. Gold reserves show an increase for the week of \$12,800,000 and total cash reserves an increase of \$90,000. The reserve ratio declined from 43.6 per cent to 43.3 per cent.

SALES AT AUCTION. 11,990 ALIENS WEEK'S TOTAL. 8,026 Have Been Examined at Ellis Island. During the last week 8,026 immigrants arrived and were examined at Ellis Island, according to an announcement yesterday. The figures do not include 1,100 passengers of the White Star liner Olympic, who are held on suspicion of typhus, and the 1,650 steerage passengers of the Regina d'Italia, of 680 remaining on the Dante Alighieri. Actual arrivals this week, therefore, were 11,990, and this record, it is believed, will be surpassed in coming weeks.

COTTON GOODS REVIEW.

Cotton goods buyers are doing very little new business. The demand is light and many uncertainties confront the trade. Prices are softening in gray goods markets and yarns are showing signs of declining generally. The underwear and hosiery trades are particularly dull. Goods are not accumulating in first hands and both underwear and yarn manufacturers incline toward curtailing production as soon as orders are filled.
