5 DROWNED; SCORE OF BATHERS IN PERIL

Undertow at Long Beach Causes Panic, With Many Narrow Escapes. LIFE GUARDS KEPT BUSY

Two Sink Within Few Feet of Each Other at Rockaway—Women Near Death.

A strong undertow that swept along the near by beaches dragged three men to their death off Rockaway and Long Beach yesterday, and at the former resort endangered the lives of a score of others who were saved with great difficulty.

The double drowning immediately called the attention of the police and the life savers to the danger other bathers were in and the beach soon was guarded more closely than before.

Ford's body was recovered by Capt. Oscar Strohbecker of the Rockaway Point Life Saving Station. Thompson's body washed in near shore, and was taken from the surf by bathers.

According to life guards and boatmen who were familiar with the tides and currents off the Rockaway, the undertow that set in yesterday was the worst recorded in twenty years.

The fifth death of the day was that of Carl A. Johnson of 565 Henry street, Brooklyn. He fell off the deck of the barge Harry F. near the Tidewater Oil Company's pier at Bayonne, and was drowned before rescuers could reach him.

At almost the same time a girl was carried out beyond the ropes at Beach Eighty-fifth street. She was 300 feet from shore when Joseph Citron of 1129 Franklin avenue, Brooklyn, aided by half a dozen others, brought her ashore.

At long Beach Irving Crutcher, 21, of 953 Flatbush avenue, Brooklyn, was the victim of the undertow. His body was found by bathers and brought to shore.

MEXICO NOT SEEKING TO GET LOAN IN U. S. Alvarado Coming Here Only to Study Finances.

MEXICO CITY, July 11.—The purpose of the coming visit to the United States of Gen. Alvarado, the Minister of Finance, will be to aid in his study of the Mexican economic problem.

175,000 MEN TO SWIM AT STATEN ISLAND

Record Sunday Crowd Swamps Ferry Houses and Fights Police. 35 LOST CHILDREN HELD

Scenes Treated for Minor Hurts—Congestion Lasts All Night.

More than 175,000 men, women and children visited the resorts on Staten Island yesterday, and when all of them tried to return to Manhattan at the same time last night the riot that ensued required the attention of every available policeman in Richmond Borough.

So far as the police could learn late last night, no one was seriously hurt during the crush in the ferry house. Ambulance surgeons from the Staten Island Hospital treated thirty-eight women who had fainted, and several others were attended to after they had fallen and had been kicked about by the plunging crowd.

The crowd yesterday was the largest that Staten Island has ever entertained, according to the estimates of the police. The visitors began coming early in the morning, and by noon the crush had become so great that the Municipal Ferry board to run six boats instead of the usual four.

There were only four ticket sellers on duty when the first of the great crowd began to sweep down the hills in the special steam railroad trains and the trolleys that were running to St. George from all points of the island on a two and three minute headway.

At midnight the crowd was still strung out nearly half a mile back from the ticket windows and transportation officials declared it would be 5 o'clock this morning before the last of them would have been able to leave the island.
