

## ULSTER IS IN ARMS FOR BOYNE HOLIDAY

Roads Leading Into Belfast  
Patrolled and All Travel-  
lers Searched.

3,000 SOLDIERS ARE SENT

Open Hostilities by Sinn Fein  
Feared To-day During  
Celebration.

BELFAST, July 11.—On the eve of  
Ulster's greatest holiday, the 12th of  
July, anniversary of the battle of the  
Boyne, its municipal buildings for the  
first time in recent history are occupied  
by troops, while soldiers on the roads  
into the city prevent any one from en-  
tering or leaving without a search for  
arms. Thousands in Belfast's streets  
to-night seem bent on starting the hol-  
iday early, and keen observers say that  
the precautions taken to forestall a  
Nationalist outbreak far surpass the  
danger.

Some of the Ulster leaders, fearing  
that the Sinn Feiners might seize the  
occasion of the Orange holiday to open  
hostilities, sent a delegation to the Cab-  
inet requesting an increase to the 300  
troops stationed here. More than 3,000  
men were sent.

As always, every Unionist household  
displayed its Union Jack, some from  
seemingly inaccessible tops of the high-  
est trees in the yards and from the  
steeples of almost every church floated  
the same emblem.

At least 20,000 Ulstermen to-morrow  
will parade four miles to hear speeches  
from five platforms and generally make  
merry.

Seventeen speakers are on the pro-  
gramme, with the interest centering on  
Sir Edward Carson. He has not yet in-  
timated the exact line of his address  
but it is expected to harmonize with the  
known intentions of others to denounce  
the Sinn Fein. Sir Edward will speak  
to the following resolution:

"We desire again to record our faith-  
ful remembrance of the deliverance  
granted our country in the past and our  
firm determination to defend the civil  
and religious liberties for which our an-  
cestors fought at the Boyne. Confident  
in the goodness of our cause, we ask  
God's help to enable us to meet success-  
fully the difficulties and dangers of the  
present time."

Another resolution appeals to the  
Government to deal resolutely with "the  
cruel and treacherous warfare which is  
being carried on in Ireland, involving  
the sacrifice of lives and senseless de-  
struction of property."

Seven justices of the peace in Cavan  
county jointly tendered their resig-  
nations. In their letter they said:  
"We no longer wish to be associated  
with an executive whose actions are  
subversive of justice and equity and re-  
pugnant to the feelings of a vast ma-  
jority of our fellow countrymen."

In Belfast to-day quiet prevails. The  
military gave permission to the Derry  
Orangemen to carry out a foundation  
stone laying ceremony near the city.  
Previously the stone laying had been  
prohibited in the fear of a demonstra-  
tion.

Many outrages occurred in and around  
Cork to-day. Sergeant Heery is dying  
in the Cork Military Hospital from sev-  
eral bullet wounds received in an attack  
upon him while he was carrying the po-  
lice mail to the Greah Post Office, near  
Cork. His assailant seized the mail and  
decamped.

The sergeant in charge of the Rath-  
more (Cork) barracks was killed by a  
bomb and two constables were wounded  
while defending the barracks from an  
attack. Three abandoned police bar-  
racks in Cork city were burned to-day.

DUBLIN, July 10.—The Cork Court  
House was occupied to-day by troops,  
which effected barred wire entangle-  
ments, sandbags and other defenses.  
The troops removed a republican tri-  
color which had floated over the build-  
ing for several weeks.

LONDON, July 11.—The report of the  
mission headed by Sir Stuart Samuel,  
sent by the British Government last  
September to investigate conditions in  
Poland, has been published, together  
with a covering letter by Sir H. Rum-  
bold. It deals largely with the treat-  
ment of Jews, which the report says is  
being "gradually mitigated" and "will  
abate when peace has been restored and  
the presence of foreigners in their coun-  
try, will shame the Poles into more civil-  
ized treatment of their near neigh-  
bors."

The report declares that massacres of  
Jews in Poland were not pogroms or  
State superintended and authorized  
slaughterings, but were manifestations  
of popular animosity on the part of ig-  
norant men, misled in many instances by  
men of education. In many cases, the  
report says, the police participated in  
acts of aggression against Jews.

Sir H. Rumbold's letter says: "Unless  
all information on the point is entirely  
inaccurate the massacres of Jews by  
Ukrainian peasant bands can find in  
their extent and thoroughness no paral-  
lel except in the massacres of Armeni-  
ans in Turkey."

RUSSIAN PRISONERS REVOLT.  
March on Antwerp and Are In-  
terned in Fort.

ANTWERP, July 11.—A force of 700  
Russian prisoners of war who had been  
interned near Turnhout, twenty-five  
miles northeast of this city, escaped  
from the internment camp last night  
and marched upon Antwerp. A regiment  
of cavalry sent in pursuit of the Rus-  
sians surrounded them and interned  
them anew in one of the Antwerp forts.  
The prisoners were a part of a con-

tingent of 1,100 Russians who were to  
be released on Saturday for return  
home. They were informed late in the  
day, however, that owing to failure  
by Great Britain and the Soviet Gov-  
ernment to reach a definite agreement  
they would have to endure further de-  
tention. Incensed at this, 700 of the  
prisoners rushed the barred wire bar-  
riers, overpowered the sentries and pro-  
ceeded in marching order toward Ant-  
werp. No report had been made up to  
this morning as to the casualties during  
the incident.

NANSEN PLEADS WITH  
REDS FOR AMERICANS  
League's Envoy in Moscow  
With U. S. Commission.

MOSCOW, July 9.—Dr. Fridtjof Nansen  
has arrived here to negotiate with the  
Soviet Government for the repatriation of  
foreigners and Russian prisoners abroad.  
Although he represents the League of  
Nations he is being treated as a private  
citizen.

Dr. Nansen will have his first confer-  
ence to-night with M. Tchitcherine, the  
Bolshevik Foreign Minister. At the re-  
quest of the American Government Dr.  
Nansen will take up the question of the  
repatriation of Americans in Russia.

Dr. Nansen expressed himself as in  
favor of a resumption of trade relations  
between Russia and other countries.

Surrendered Zeppelin in France.  
MARSEILLE, France, July 11.—The  
huge super-Zeppelin L-12, surrendered  
by the Germans to France in accord-  
ance with the Treaty of Versailles, ar-  
rived here this morning.

JAPANESE MINISTRY  
SUSTAINED 283 TO 145  
Police Clash With Paraders in  
Free Speech Agitation.

TOKYO, July 10.—The Government re-  
ceived the confidence of the House of  
Representatives to-day, when the House  
defeated a resolution of want of confi-  
dence in the Ministry by 145 votes for  
the resolution and 283 against it.

During the debate in the Diet and the  
developments outside to-day the ten-  
dency toward freedom of speech and  
action along liberal lines that have been  
observable recently continued to mani-  
fest themselves. Three big meetings in  
promotion of the agitation for universal  
suffrage were held here, attended by ad-  
herents of 100 or more universal suf-  
frage associations in the provinces, in  
addition to the masses of Tokio sup-  
porters of the movement.

Speeches of a violent character were  
made at these gatherings and paraders  
carrying banners subsequently clashed  
with the police, a number of arrests  
being made.

In passing a policeman coughed, and  
Michael O'Donnell, in a jocular mood,  
also coughed. The police resented this  
and one of them, alleged to have been  
Sergeant Mooney, struck Michael O'Don-  
nell with a rifle, knocking him down and  
fracturing his jaw. Michael was carried  
unconscious by his brothers to a house,  
where it is declared he now lies in a  
critical condition.

The news of the assault created indig-  
nation at Dugloo, according to the re-  
port, and the following day Mooney was  
shot by a person stationed in an un-  
occupied house in Douglas. Whether  
Mooney will recover from his wounds is  
considered doubtful.

N. Y. BOYS MIXED UP  
IN IRISH AFFAIR  
Jocular Cough Leads to At-  
tack and Reprisal.

LONDON, July 11.—The attack on  
a party of police in which Sergeant  
Mooney was wounded while returning  
from the post office to the barracks at  
Dugloo is attributed to an unpleasant  
experience of three American children,  
Michael, Eugene and Niel O'Donnell of  
New York, brothers, who are visiting  
Donaghy. The O'Donnells attended a  
fair at Douglas a few days ago, and  
while returning to the residence of  
friends the same evening met a party of  
police on the road some miles from Dun-  
gloe.

PRINCE HENRY PUT  
IN CELL, TORTURED  
Kaiser's Brother Is Victim of  
Field Laborers.

BERLIN, July 11.—An almost incred-  
ible story of ill-treatment of the for-  
mer German Emperor's brother, Prince  
Henry of Prussia, by a riotous gang of  
field laborers, is told by the Ost  
Preussische Zeitung, which asserts that  
it had the information direct from Prince  
Henry's family.

According to the informant, some time  
ago a gang of sixty men, led by a pri-  
vate in a Hussar's uniform and wear-  
ing a big red rosette, invaded Prince  
Henry's Schleswig-Holstein country seat  
on the pretext of searching for hidden  
arms. The invaders turned the place  
inside out, but found no arms.

Then the leader said to the Prince:  
"Come, Henry," whereupon Prince Henry  
was made to run the gauntlet, suffering  
innumerable kicks and blows. After-  
ward he was locked up in a jail at  
Birkenhead, where he was tortured  
nightly. He was awakened every ten  
minutes with "Get up, Henry; turn on  
the light. Lie down, Henry," amid jeers  
and insults from his captors.
