

**VILLA'S SURRENDER
PRICE IS \$2,000,000**

Will Retire to Huge Estate
With Bodyguard of Fifty
Trusted Officers.

ALL OTHERS GET FARMS

Bandit Is Now Leading His
900 Men to Designated Place
of Disarmament.

SAN PEDRO, Coahuila, Mexico, Aug. 7.—Under the terms of his "unconditional" surrender Francisco Villa, Mexican bandit leader, will get a huge estate at Canutillo, State of Durango, where he will be guarded for the remainder of his life by fifty of his trusted followers, who will be paid by the Government, it was learned here today.

Villa's surrender will cost the Mexican Government \$2,000,000 gold, according to estimates.
Villa, with 900 officers and men, is en route over the desert to San Pedro from Ojastro Cleugas for final arrangements for his surrender and the disarming of his forces. He will reach here Monday and then march to Gomez Palacio, where his men will be disarmed and receive a year's pay prior to being given farms, where the men themselves designate, throughout Mexico. Part of them will be in the northern tier of States.
Villa has spies in every Mexican town and hamlet, and these also are en route to Gomez Palacio to share in the surrender terms.

The personal guard of fifty men Villa will select, it is presumed, will be from among his most trusted officers, thus keeping a nucleus for another revolutionary army if he becomes dissatisfied.
The guard will be paid according to the rank the various officers held under Villa, and cannot be displaced, according to the official agreement Gen. Eugenio Martinez made public here.
According to the agreement signed on July 25, Villa gave his "word of honor" never to fight against the constitutional Government or against Mexico, and Mar-

lines gave his word of honor that the conditions agreed on would be complied with strictly.

The agreement creates in Mexico a situation paralleling that resulting in the United States from the Indian settlements.
Villa's surrender is an independent as ever.

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 7.—Gen. Juan Barragan, formerly Chief of Staff to President Carranza, who was imprisoned here in connection with the death of Carranza and who later escaped, was sheltered by the Italian Legation and given a passport by the Spanish Legation or Consulate here, according to a statement made today by Dr. Hildaigo, under secretary in charge of the Foreign Office. He declared he had received this information from Ramon P. de Negri, Mexican Consul in New York.
Stefano Carrara, Italian Minister here, denied Dr. Hildaigo's charge that the Italian Legation sheltered the fugitive, and the latter asserted he had heard the Spanish Legation likewise denied any connection with the escape of Gen. Barragan. No formal statement has as yet been issued by the Spanish Legation.

**U. S. DESTROYER FOR
LOWER CALIFORNIA**

Civilians Leaving Hotbed of Cantu Rebellion.

SAN DIEGO, Cal., Aug. 7.—The United States destroyer Bailey has been ordered, according to announcement of naval officers here, to be ready to sail at four hours' notice for Ensenada, Lower California. An exodus of civilians from Ensenada in anticipation of a possible clash between Mexican Federal troops and the forces of Gov. Estaban Cantu is under way, according to reports reaching here.
The motorship Gyrene is bringing forty women and children from Ensenada, according to reports, and it was said that several hundred refugees unable to obtain accommodations aboard vessels were hurrying northward on the military road leading to Tijuana.

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 7.—A commission of Lower Californians today submitted to Provisional President de la Huerta a list of names from which he is requested to select a Governor of their State to replace Estaban Cantu. Those suggested were Carlos Berstein, David Zarate, Ricardo Romero and Epigenio Ibarra. All are business men.

Mexico city advices on July 29 announcing the arrival of the commission

there stated that its members insisted that the State Executive should be a native of Lower California and that they claimed Gov. Cantu was not.

New Foreign Minister in Mexico.
WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The American

Embassy at Mexico city advised the State Department today that Dr. Cutberto Hildaigo, sub-secretary of foreign affairs and formerly a member of the Mexican Senate, had assumed charge of the Mexican Foreign Office, succeeding Miguel Covarrubias, who has been appointed Minister to Great Britain.
