

'Trovatore' Opens Lexington Season

Commonwealth Opera Starts—Hammerstein Memorial Concert To-night.

Every possible musical fancy is to be richly satisfied during the next eight months or more if each of numerous projects meets with success.

On the night of Labor Day the National Commonwealth Opera Company is to start its season in the Lexington Theatre with a performance of "Il Trovatore."

The project in the Lexington also includes a series of Sunday night concerts, which are to be opened September 20, with the first joint recital by Harold Bauer and Troscha Szelak.

The third early season operatic project is to be opened in Brooklyn on the night of September 14, when the Italian Lyric Federation, of which Alfredo Salamasi is director, will give the first of a projected series of operatic performances in the Brooklyn Academy of Music.
