

WEEK TO SOCIALIZE ITALIAN INDUSTRY

Unions Indorse Seizure by Workers of Metallurgical Factories.

ROME, Sept. 6.—Hope is entertained that a satisfactory solution will be found to the metal workers' dispute. The workers' unions, however, have adopted a resolution, which is approved also by the leaders of the Socialist party, to the effect that the conflict, if it could not be settled, must not be limited to one category of workers, but extend to the socialization of all forms of production.

ere also refuse to discuss any concessions so long as the works are arbitrarily occupied by the men. During the course of the negotiations which continue, the plant owners have shown a disposition to agree to put their establishments on a cooperative basis. Considerable time, even months, however, is necessary for the completion of such arrangements. The Minister of Labor and Signor Meila have therefore proposed an immediate increase in wages of from ten to twenty per cent, which increase would be repaid to the owners when the cooperative system is working. The strikers are keeping strict discipline among their number. A watch-dog is necessary for the completion of a truck with soldiers and police was punished by imprisonment in a cage and kept there in a humiliating position under threat, which was not fulfilled, of having metal polishing sand played upon him.

The most serious punishments are threatened those who disobey the orders of the commissions managing the occupied works or who destroy or steal materials. All workers leaving the works are rigorously searched by the strikers' sentinels.

BARON AVEZZANA EXPLAINS SEIZURE

Involves Only Metal Trades, Says Ambassador.

The Italian newspapers here print a communication from the Italian Ambassador, Baron Avezzana, concerning the workers' agitation in Italy. It says: "In consequence of a shortage of raw materials, lack of coal and high cost

of labor, the metallurgical industries decided to effect a lockout. Following this decision the workers seized the factories at Milan, Turin and Genoa in order to prevent the lockout and to operate the factories directly. "Such a move is a new form of struggle between capital and labor, but preserves the character of an economic struggle, inasmuch as it is developing without resort to violence and without bloodshed. "The situation is not alarming in the least, inasmuch as the struggle is involving only the metallurgical industry. "It is noteworthy that the manifesto issued by the Socialist concentration (which includes M. Tursi, Traves, et al.), signed among others by Deputy Buozzi, leader of the metallurgical movement, urges the workers to avoid any excess. "The general situation of the country is normal."

FRENCH DRIVE BACK TURKS. Capture Town in Asia Minor from Nationalist Forces.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 6.—Aintab, a city in Asia Minor, fifty-eight miles northeast of Aleppo, and the scene several months ago of a massacre of Armenians by Turks, has been taken by French troops. The city was held by two Turkish brigades. French forces are marching on Marash, thirty-seven miles northwest of Aintab, and are meeting with obstinate resistance from Turkish Nationalist troops. Marash has been the scene of a number of encounters between the Turks and Armenians during the last few months.

Government responsible for the death of the Lord Mayor. The resolution reads: "This conference, representing 6,500-7,000 organized workers, views with horror and indignation the Government's decision to allow the Lord Mayor of Cork to die. We wish to remind the Government that rebellion was first preached by those who are condemning to death all others who are fighting for the freedom of their country. We, in the name of the whole organized labor movement, will hold the Government responsible for the death of the Lord Mayor of Cork, and remind them that such blind stupidity will render reconciliation between Ireland and England almost impossible."

Mayor Frank Hague of Jersey City, N. J., has sent a cablegram protesting against the incarceration of Lord Mayor George MacSwiney of Cork to Premier Lloyd George, according to announcement at the City Hall, Jersey City, today. Mayor Hague's cablegram follows: "As Mayor of Jersey City, New Jersey, U. S. A., I join with other liberty loving people in asking the release of Lord Mayor MacSwiney. To allow him to die in prison in the existing circumstances would be an outrage on civilization the world over."
