SIXTEEN DAYS LATER NEWS.

ARRIVAL OF THE ACADIA AT BOSTON AND PRESIDENT AT NEW YORK.

THE ROYAL MAIL STEAMSHIP, Acadia, Capt. Miller, arrived at Boston, on Saturday morning, very early, and reached her dock at half past eight o'clock.



DEATH OF PRINCESS AGUSTA.—On the 23d of September, at twenty minutes past seven o'clock, departed this life, at Clarence House, St. James's Palace, after a long and painful illness, her Royal Highness the Princess Augusta Sophia, sister to her most gracious Majesty, the Queen.

WARRIUM PREPARATIONS.—The war steamer Polyphemus and the ship of the line London, were launched at Chatham on Monday, with the usual ceremonies. The order of the day was read, and it is intended partly for fighting and partly to be used as a transport.

DISMISSAL OF CAPTAIN FAYRE.—On Wednesday the following notice was posted at the Exchange News room, and Underwriters' room:—A meeting of the friends of the late Captain F. W. Harmer, was held at the Cotton Sales room, at eleven o'clock this forenoon, for the purpose of inquiring into the cause of his late abrupt dismissal from the command of the "President" when the vessel was on her way to New York.

THE LOST TRIBES.—The Rev. Mr. Samuel, of Bombay, states that he has discovered, and for several months lived among, the remnant of the ten tribes of Israel, located on the southwest shores of the Caspian Sea, and surrounded by a circle of mountains. He reports them to be living in the exercise of their religious customs, in a primitive manner, distinct from the customs of modern Judaism.
