DESTRUCTION OF THE NATIONAL LIBRARY--NARROW ESCAPE OF THE CAPITOL--BAKER'S HOTEL CONSUMED, ETC.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24, 1851.

The Congressional Library was nearly destroyed by fire to-day, and the whole Capitol was very nearly consumed.

The fire was discovered at half past seven o'clock this morning in the Library of Congress by a watchman. The flames were first seen issuing from a table near the centre of the room, and soon enveloped the shelves in the northwest side. A few buckets of water would have suppressed the fire, but before they could be procured, the entire library was in flames. The smoke was so dense that the persons who rushed in were unable to save any of the contents, except four or five portraits of the Presidents.

The marble busts and splendid cases--one of them tastefully adorned and filled, with twelve hundred bronze medals presented by Valmore--together with all the splendid works of art in the case, were consumed.

The entire library contained upwards of 50,000 volumes, including the Library of Jefferson, which formed the nucleus. All in the main room is lost. The books in an adjoining room, (upwards of twenty thousand, including the law library,) were saved. The total loss of books is variously estimated at between \$100,000 and \$200,000; but no money can replace many of the works thus destroyed.

The roof of the library is all burned, and the exterior of the building, on the west, is blackened. The parapet wall has expanded, so as to render its removal necessary.

At one time, such was the progress of the flames that the dome was in imminent danger, as well as the roof of both houses. The dome and roof are made of wood, supported by a framework of iron, and were completely consumed.

An engine was placed in the rotunda, and every passage was flooded with water. The greater part of the water was conveyed in buckets.

The two chambers of Congress are uninjured, and business will not be arrested.

The utmost activity was exhibited by all classes of citizens, thousands of whom were in attendance. The marines stationed here were ordered out by government authorities personally excited themselves. The whole of the mechanics and marines belonging to the Navy Yard, worked incessantly till the flames were extinguished. The President and members of the cabinet were on the ground all the morning, giving directions, and urging on the frames and workmen to almost superhuman exertions.

We noticed prominently among the workers Senator W. P. M. Gales, who was in the front line of the fire.

The water had to be conveyed into the Capitol from the basins in the grounds, there being no reservoirs anywhere in the building itself.

Owing to the dense volume of smoke, all attempts to save anything when the fire was first discovered, were unavailing. The cold was intense, and the firemen suffered very much. The heat from the burning books in the library was overpowering, but the ceiling being fire-proof, the roof was partially protected.

It has not yet been ascertained how the fire originated. The library was heated by gas, and there having been no fire in the room for many years, the fire must, or been communicated through the hot air flues, or been the work of an incendiary. Of course the whole matter will be thoroughly investigated.

The flames were subdued by twelve o'clock.

A guard of marines had been detailed to watch during the night.

A fire in the Franklin Hotel took place before daylight.

The boarders, and the family of Mr. Baker, escaped with difficulty.

THE LATEST RELATIVE TO THE FIRE.

WASHINGTON, December 24--10 P. M.

About sixty thousand volumes of the Library of Congress were destroyed, exceeding in value a quarter of a million of dollars. Jefferson's library, for which Congress paid forty thousand dollars, was entirely consumed. Many of these books were highly valuable, on account of the marginal notes in Jefferson's handwriting. Rare books, presented by foreign governments, to a large amount, are also gone. The fire was caused, no doubt, from the intense heat of the fires.

Important from Mexico.

BALTIMORE, Dec. 24, 1851.

The Southern mail arrived this morning, bringing us the latest news from the States. They contain dates from the city of Mexico to the 25th ult., and Vera Cruz to the 26th inst.

Important modifications of the tariff had passed the Mexican Chamber of Deputies, but its passage by the Senate was considered doubtful.

The appearance of the British fleet off Vera Cruz had caused much speculation in Mexico. It was supposed that the British fleet was intended to land on the night of the 31st of October, a row took place at Acapulco, in which the captain and surgeon of the Commodore's ship, and several Frenchmen, were severely wounded.

The Mexican Senate adopted a report adverse to the proposition to construct a railroad from Acapulco to the city of Mexico.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 24, 1851.

Kosuth arrived here this forenoon, and took up his quarters at the United States Hotel.
