At the first board, to-day, Delaware and Hudson declined 2 per cent; Erie, Duane, 1 1/2; Reading Railroad advanced 1/2 per cent; Long Island, 1/2; Canton Company, 1/2; Morris Canal, 1/2; Rochester and Syracuse, 1/2. At the second board, prices were less firm, and there was more activity in the fancies generally. Reading Railroad declined 1/2 per cent; Erie Railroad, 1/2; Delaware and Hudson, 2. The total decline in the last named stock, to-day, reaches four per cent, and according to the report of sales, only about four hundred shares changed hands...

The receipt at the office of the Assistant Treasurer of this port, to-day, amounted to \$70,493 09; payments \$130,593 82. Balance, \$8,199,904 77. The steamship Pacific from Liverpool, brings four days later intelligence from all parts of Europe. The advances, commercially, are rather favorable. There had been more activity in the cotton market with a slight improvement in quotations. In other markets there has been no new feature. The demand for American securities continues the same, without any change in quotations...

The House of Delegates of Delaware has, by a vote of twelve to seven, passed a bill chartering the Newcastle and Frenchtown Railroad. The condition on which this company is re-chartered, for twenty years, is that it is to pay two hundred thousand dollars, in annual installments of twenty thousand dollars each. Of this sum one hundred and sixty-five thousand are to be appropriated by the State to the construction of a railroad from Dover Landing, near Dover, to Seaford, Sussex county, and the balance, thirty-five thousand, to go into the State treasury...
