The Conference met yesterday morning at the Methodist Episcopal Church in Allen street, Bishop Simpson presiding. The exercises were commenced by prayer, being offered by Rev. John Clark after which the minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

The examination of the characters of the members of the Conference was then continued. A lengthy discussion here arose as to whether the Conference had jurisdiction over matters of debt on the part of the ministry, but it was decided in the negative, allowing the Conference jurisdiction only in regard to the ministerial character of the members.

The Committee on Temporal Economy reported resolutions which were adopted, making the appropriation for the year 1884 \$100,000. On motion of the President, the report of the Committee on the Allen Street Methodist Episcopal Church, was appointed as the time and place when the ordination of deacons should be held.

The report of the Presiding Elder of the Long Island District (S. S. Landon) was then read. The report states that the district is in good condition with the exception that the ministers' characters with the exception of the following: The examination of the ministers' characters was then introduced to the Conference.
