Maryland Election.

An election for Congress and State officers took place in Maryland to-day, but as yet few returns have been received.

In the Thirtieth and Seventeenth wards of Baltimore the majority for Ligon, Democrat, for Governor, is 320--a waig gain since last year of 204.

Disaster to the Brig Humboldt.

The brig Humboldt, Gen. of Boston, from Little Erasm, arrived here to-day, reports that on the 18th ultimo, in latitude twenty-nine, longitude seventy-nine, she experienced a violent gale from the north, which continued until the morning of the 19th, when the wind suddenly shifted to the southwest, and blew a complete hurricane, during which the vessel was thrown upon her beam ends, and the right hand had to cut away the foremast, which took the jibboom and mainmast. She lost her boat, and all her sails except three studding sails; had her deck swept of every thing, and received other trifling damage.

On the 20th October, in latitude thirty-one, longitude eighty-nine, she spoke ship Hartford, of Southport, from Mobile for Liverpool.

BURNING OF STEAM PLANNING MILL AT LAWRENCE, MASS.--REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT OF BEING THE ACCOMPLISHMENT OF BURGLARS, &c.

The steam planing mill of the Merrimack River Lumber Company, in Lawrence, together with a large amount of lumber, was destroyed by fire last night. Loss about \$25,000, one half of which is fully insured.

Deputy Sheriff Babbitt, of Barre, Mass., was convicted at Worcester yesterday of being an accomplice of burglars, who robbed a house in that town. The defence moved to set aside the verdict, on the ground that one of the jury was drunk at the time during the trial. The court reserved its decision.

A fire occurred in Canebury street last night, in a building owned by Mr. Butler. The building was destroyed, and the loss is about \$10,000. Mr. Butler's property was insured.
