The manner of administering medicines by inhalation is two-fold—by an "inhaling instrument," and by diffusing the vapor through the chamber in which the patient is placed...

The inhaler is made of glass, and the one contrived by myself will hold about a pint of water. The entrance is in the center of the top, and is furnished with a cork which is of glass, and passes from the top of the cork down the fluid, to within a quarter of an inch of the bottom...

In addition to the use of the inhaler, a chamber in the patient's house is daily filled with vapor, which he goes several times a day to breathe in. The chamber is of iron, and is furnished with a glass door, and is placed in the room in which he resides, and his bed-room as well, is kept moderately charged with vapor...
