INTERESTING FROM CHINA.

Our Shanghai Correspondence.

SHANGHAI, China, Jan. 8, 1856.

The Property of the Port—Great Increase of Trade—Improvement of the Navigation of the Yangtze—Hobson—Its Advance—The Grand Canal—What Should the United States do—The Black Lotus—Nanking—100,000 Victims.

Something over one hundred million pounds of tea has been shipped from China last year (1855). Of that aggregate Shanghai has furnished eight-tenths. From all China, during the same period, there were exported fifty-eight thousand bales of silk, of which Shanghai supplied one thousand six hundred and thirty-four.

Eighty-four American vessels entered and cleared at this port, the same period. It is now, beyond a doubt, the nucleus of foreign trade in China, and will ere long furnish a trade astonishing to those unacquainted with the resources of this vast commercial empire.

The working out and buying of the entrance to this port is now complete. The light ship on the North bank is recently stationed, and will serve as a sure guide against that dangerous bank. The wooden buoys are now in use, but will be replaced as soon as the iron ones arrive, which have been ordered. The sailing directions, which were those of some improvements, have been issued and generally circulated.

The rebellion, which has apparently been dormant for so long a time, now seems to be again stirring up, for it has broken out with great force, and totally overthrown the imperial rule in the wealthy and tea producing province of Honan. This province is on the Yangtze river. It is the first time since the beginning of this rebellion that the tea districts have been closed. This prohibited this time ago, and then recommended a plan by which its interests and trade might be secured.

The rebels have been driven from the tea districts, and have retreated to hold their own; they have sacrificed men and money with a lavish hand, the latter to such an extent as to have exhausted the resources of the province. To tribute any more, hence the rebellion in Honan. Honan, too, the richest province in the empire, (Mr. Ho), is now visited by a dreadful famine, on which has followed the rebellion, and which has been but a trifling cause, and will place us in a position that, if we do not protect ourselves, such a policy is feasible. But even this policy could not be effected through the rebels, and the Emperor and his ministers, and his army, are now in a position that, if we do not protect ourselves, such a policy is feasible.

The rebels still hold Nanking, but a terrible plague has broken out among them, which the Chinese assert has cost of 100,000 inhabitants. Before the rebellion the population of Nanking was 1,000,000, but it is supposed that at no time during the siege has its population exceeded 500,000.
