Nouva Cal, New Caledonia, August 25, 1859. Commercial, Agricultural and Mining Resources of the South Pacific Islands...

With a branch of the United States Court, which Congress has authorized to hold in New Caledonia, the officers which could be elected in accordance with Governor Rencher's suggestion, we should have all the legal authorities necessary in Arizona at present, and at very small expense...
