FROM McLELLAN'S ARMY.

Highly Important Movements on the Peninsula.

A Great Battle Reported to Have Been Fought on Thursday.

NO PARTICULARS RECEIVED.

RAIDERS, JUNE 29 - P. M.

I have detailed accounts of events at White House, before Richmond, and on the Peninsula during the last four days, including facts obtained from Washington, having been sent by special train to communicate with the President. We have the grand military triumph over the enemy, and Richmond saved.

Refugees taken on board by our gunboats report that Jackson, Price and Beauregard are in Richmond, and will be assigned important commands shortly.

It was rumored in the rebel camp yesterday that Jackson had turned McClellan's right wing.

General McClellan had issued an order prohibiting uniformed persons from leaving the White House.

No soldiers, sick or well, are allowed to go north of the White House for a few days.

Several private dispatches have been received here to-day from General McClellan's headquarters, dated this morning, reporting that the friends of the recipients were well.

This leads to the supposition that there has been a battle, the result of which has not yet been made public by the War Department.
