

THE NEW ARMY.

Colonel William B. Olmsted is in New York City, actively engaged in raising one of the new regiments called for by the President's proclamation for three hundred thousand men.

The Colonel is a native of Auburn, Cayuga county, in the State of New York. He is from a fighting family, his grandfather having been a major in the Revolutionary war.

Colonel Olmsted did further service to his country, in originating the celebrated Elsworth Zouaves, and in introducing among them the system of tactics for which they became distinguished.

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

Today's bank statement compares as follows with that of last Monday:

The increase in the specie column would doubtless have been more considerable but for the withdrawal of special deposits for shipments abroad, and likewise for the sales of coin by some of the banks, who fixed ten per cent premium as a good figure at which to realize some of their surplus specie.

Money is moderately active at 5 1/2 per cent, most of the loans of which we hear to-day being at the latter rate.

Exchange advanced to 121 1/2 to 122 for bankers' bills on London. At the opening bankers were willing to sell at 121 1/2, but a demand for Havana account springing up, raised their rates to 121 1/2, sold freely at that figure, and then asked 122.

The stock market was irregular to-day. Government, State stocks and New York Railway shares were lower at the first board; the Western shares were generally higher.

The Sub-Treasury received to-day a million of small notes from Washington. Advice from Congress predict the passage of the Treasury Note bill within a day or two.

The earnings of the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne and Chicago Railroad for the first five months of 1862 were \$1,430,000, of which it is understood that about \$750,000 were net profit.
